Dear Parents & Carers,

As you know, year 6 SATS begin on Monday morning. It is vital that children are in school at **8:50am** every morning of the week.

Pupils must also bring gloves for ice skating or they will not be able to partake in this activity. Children also need a packed lunch. **Please ensure all trip letters are returned, if not, the pupil will not be able to attend.**

Year 6 will take part in a production in the summer term. We have begun to look at the songs in music sessions, and will read through the script on Tuesday afternoon. The following week (**Tuesday 22**nd **May**) we will be holding auditions for parts; please encourage the children to start considering how much of a role they wish to play in the production.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, year 6 will make a pair of slippers as part of DT. Children may wish to start collecting some fabric, materials and in soles for these.

All year 6's need their PE kits on Monday as we will be doing PE as a year group in the afternoon.

Year 6 Summer Term Trip

Dear Parents.

Year 6 are working extremely hard but we have much to look forward to in the Summer Term. To celebrate the end of SATS week, we are going to the Spectrum centre in Guildford to do ice skating and bowling. We will be travelling by coach on the Friday of SATs week.

We have a Shakespeare workshop in June, to understand and act out *The Merchant of Venice*, which will be followed by watching a performance of the Shakespeare play at The Orange Tree Theatre. If the weather is dry we will have a picnic lunch on Richmond green after the performance.

As part of our Science work we have a scientist coming in to talk to the children about evolution. He will share photographs and real finds including teeth and skeletons. Year 6 really enjoyed this workshop last year.

We are visiting Kew Gardens to look at the variety of plants, flowers and seeds as well as to support our Geography and Science work on biomes and adaptation. We will also have an opportunity to enjoy views from the Treetop Walk.

We will be visiting The National Portrait Gallery to view the art and complete a workshop. Children will learn about portrait drawing and choose their own winner of the BP Portrait Award.

Year 6 will be involved in a transition workshop, which is held at Cornerstone on Canbury Park Road. They will meet with other year 6's in the borough. Each pupil will also receive an 'It's Your Move' book, which is a guide to moving to secondary school. These are donated by local churches.

We are hoping to visit a Sikh temple, to support our RE work this term. The date for this still needs to be confirmed.

We have chosen a script for our **Year 6 Production** in July: *Shakespeare Rocks*. This promises to be a hugely enjoyable project for the children, providing an opportunity to show case all of the talent in Year 6 this year. There will be a morning and evening performance for Y6 parents on **Thursday 5th July at 9:30am and 6pm**.

As part of our outdoor PE we are offering the children the chance to learn water sports skills at Albany Park sailing club. In past years we have tried canoeing, kayaking and dragon boating. The sessions will be longer this year, but for fewer weeks; this worked well last year. The total cost of water sports will change according to the number of children that participate, but will be about £45 for the whole course.

The Year 6 Disco will be on Thursday 19th July 5:30-7:30pm. We will be compiling a play list over the coming term so please let us know of any favourites.

The children will need packed lunches for the trips to the Spectrum, Kew Gardens, National Portrait Gallery and Orange Tree Theatre. If your child would like a school packed lunch for the trip days, then please ensure you book this online via ParentPay before the usual lunch deadline. Alternatively please send your child in with a packed lunch for the trips. Please note that you should not order a hot lunch on trip days – these will be cancelled automatically by the school and a credit added to your ParentPay lunches balance if relevant.

The total contribution requested for these trips is £26.25 per child. (excluding water sports). Payment should be made online via ParentPay by 25th May. Payments can also be made by cash or cheque made payable to Fern Hill Primary School. Cash or cheques should be given in a named sealed envelope at the school office or the letterbox outside the school office together with reply slip.

Children in receipt of pupil premium or free school meals do not need to pay.

Please return the consent slip even if you pay by ParentPay, to indicate lunch preference & water sports attendance.

Once we know how many children are taking part in **water sports** we will send out separate consent forms and collect payment. Please indicate on the reply slip whether or not you would like your child to take part in water sports.

We will need adults to help on all of the trips, in order for them all to take place. Please indicate on the reply slip if you are able to help out on any of the trips. We thank you for your continued help and support.
