Top Tips for Reading!

Make books a part of your family life -Always have books around so that you and your children are ready to read whenever there's a chance.

Join the local library (most likely Tudor Drive or Kingston) - Register your child for a library card—it's free! You'll find a fantastic range of books to suit every child's taste. Allow them to pick their own books, encouraging free choice.

Match their interests - Help them find the right book—it doesn't matter if it's fiction, non-fiction, poetry or comics. There is no such thing as the 'wrong' book!

Get comfortable! - Snuggle up somewhere warm and cosy with your child, either in bed, a beanbag or on the sofa, and make sure they have somewhere comfy when reading alone.

Ask questions - To keep them interested in the story, ask your child questions as they read.

Read whenever you get the chance -

Bring a book along any time your child has to wait, such as the dentist or the doctor's surgery. Audio books are also great for long car journeys!

Read again and again - Encourage your child to re-read favourite books and poems. Re-reading helps to build up fluency and confidence.

Here at Fern Hill we are incredibly lucky to have a fully stocked library complete with our very own expert librarian, Mrs Eakin.


The KS2 library contains a wide range of books including:
