Year 3

Dear Parents/Carers,

Time flies and we are already wrapping up the first half term! This week in English, the children have been showing off what they have gleaned from our class work on information writing by independently planning, drafting and publishing their own dragon fact-file. Their work will be bound together into a class book.

In Maths, we have used our knowledge of place value to add and subtract *mentally* 10s, 100s (e.g. 279 + 40 and 802 + 200) and 1s to and from 3-digit numbers. A number of us have found it quite challenging to 'bridge' the 10s/100s and have had to work hard to partition the single digit numbers into suitable parts (e.g. 325 - 7 = 325 - 5 - 2 and 476 + 7 = 476 + 4 + 3). Any support with this at home would be greatly appreciated.

After the break, we will be consolidating these skills by solving calculations with 'missing' numbers (e.g. ______ - 8 = 375 and _____ + 4 = 402) as well as applying to problems in context.

Our handwriting work this week has been the practice of correct formation and joining of -ly, which has linked nicely to our spelling work on adding suffixes to e.g. words ending in -y. Remember if it's a verb, adding -ing is simple (cry - crying), but if -ed is to be added, swap the y for an i (try - tried), just like for changing adjectives (happy) to nouns (happiness).

We are all looking forward to a relaxing break and would like to wish you the same,

<u>English</u>: Please keep reading a variety of genres with your child. Revision of spellings done so far would also be very helpful; we are finding that many children still struggle with e.g. doubling the consonants when adding suffixes.
