Challenge 2

Compare *Goodnight Mister Tom* (the section we have read) with the film plus the film *Carrie's War*.

How were the experiences of the evacuees similar and different?

How was war time life depicted in each?

Which do you prefer? Why? (Justify your opinion)

Challenge 3

Compare *Goodnight Mister Tom* (book & film), *Carrie's war* (book extract and film) plus any other war time novels you have read.

What was life as an evacuee like? Use evidence from the texts and films to support your answer.

Which book or film do you think portrays the life of an evacuee most effectively? Why? Justify your opinion.
