Year 6 English homework 16.11.18

Due in Tuesday 27th November

In the last two weeks, we have written a petition (in the format of a letter) to the King in our core text, 'The Princess' Blankets', asking him to banish the stranger from his kingdom due to the damage caused by his magical blankets.

For homework, we would like you to write your own petition, asking for an issue that you care about to be changed. This should be in the format of a letter and can be handwritten on lined paper or typed on the computer. We will then be sending your petition on to relevant organisations such as charities or companies. Please start your letters with 'Dear Sir/Madam' – we **don't** want you to include an address at the top. Remember that you are writing to real people so you need to be persuasive but polite!

Some ideas could include:


- swapping plastic straws for paper ones due to the problems caused by plastic in the oceans
- an issue in the local area eg. more bins for litter
- an issue in school eg. a chromebook for every child
- protecting a species of endangered animal from hunting, deforestation etc.

You do not have to use the ideas above, but they might be a useful starting point.

The structure of your petition should follow the structure we looked at in lessons:

- > Introduction state what you want changed
- Paragraph 1 topic sentence about one key problem followed by facts and consequences to explain your arguments
- Paragraph 2 topic sentence about a second key problem followed by facts and consequences to explain your arguments
- > Conclusion reiterate what you want changed and summarise your argument

You can use these to help you:



Petition Toolkit:

- Specific word choices make the issue sound as negative as possible eg. critically, terribly, serious impact
- HQV expert language
- Rhetorical questions make them reflect!
- Formal tone use formal phrases
- Facts use proof to support your argument (you might need to do some research on the internet on your topic for this)
- Cohesion link your ideas together with linking phrases and subordinating conjunctions
