We have finished all our Arts' Week projects and are very much looking forward to sharing them with you next week during the Art Exhibition.


This week, we have started reading a new book called 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman. Imperative verbs have been a focus of the week as these are a feature of instructional writing. The children have had great fun creating their own firework names and ingredients. Can your child tell you about theirs? Next week, we will be using these skills to help us write instructions on how to make a firework.

In Maths, we have looked into what we mean by related facts, e.g. if I know 2 x 3=6, I also know 20 x 3 = 60 and 2 x 30 = 60. Equally, if I know $6\div3=2$, I also know that $60\div30=2$ and $60\div2=30$ etc. We have used both visuals and practical equipment to develop these reasoning skills both in problems in context and simply in 'number sentences'. During the second half of the week, we have started multiplying 2-digit by 1-digit numbers, both as repeated addition and then (first then!) using the formal column method. This work will continue next week.

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Homework

<u>Maths:</u> Children create an A4 'Factor tree' poster for display with a minimum of <u>four</u> 'trees'. Highest number to use: 144



Spelling: This week we have been practising the statutory words. Next week's learning: ch/s/ss making the sh sound.

Reading: One of the most important things you can do to help your child at school, is to read to them regularly – any books that they enjoy but also books that are still a little 'beyond' their own reading capacity. It is equally important, to hear your child read and discuss the text together. If your child is reluctant, please do share by reading alternate pages/paragraphs, working towards increasing their stamina.
