Alternatively please send your child in with a packed lunch for the trip.

The total contribution requested for these trips is **£10 per child**.

Payment should be made online via *ParentPay* by Thursday 24th January. If you are not registered on *ParentPay* you may pay by cheque, made payable to Fern Hill Primary School, which should be in a named envelope and handed to the office/class teacher. **Cash payments must be made to the school office and a receipt will be provided.**
