English

Maths

We have been partitioning two digit numbers up to 50 in Maths this week. We have used lots of different apparatus to make numbers – showing the tens and the ones. We are getting really good at counting in tens which helps us with our partitioning.

How many tens are there in 24? How many ones? Try giving different 2 digit numbers to your child and seeing if they can jump the tens and clap the ones (e.g 24 two jumps and 4 claps)
