# Year 3

Dear Parents/Carers

We hope everyone had an enjoyable half term break. We are pleased to see that the children seem refreshed and ready to learn!

We have started a new topic in English, looking at a book called 'The Pebble in my Pocket' by science writer Meredith Hooper. It has taken the whole week to get through the story as there was plenty of new vocabulary for us to learn. Learning these new words tied into our DERIC lessons where we were using different methods to explain their meanings. This is in preparation to write a diary entry from the pebble's point of view.

In Maths this week, we have been working with money - talking about the value of each coin and note, converting pence to pounds and vice versa and adding amounts together by partitioning into pounds and pence to help us. Next week, we will be moving onto working out change using the bar model.

To wrap up our Geography topic, we 'erupted' our volcanoes and carried on sharing our pupil research homework. We have launched our new topic in History on the Roman Empire, sharing facts we already know and coming up with questions we would like to investigate.



### Homework

<u>English</u>: We would like the children to consolidate their understanding of adding the prefix –ly and spelling words ending in –sure and –ture. The children should answer the questions on the sheet and then stick it into their English Homework books.

<u>Spelling:</u> This week we have been practising the spelling patterns of *-ly*, *-less*, *-ness* and *-ment*. This week's homework will focus on *-ly* endings.
