Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been lovely to see the constant trickle of wonderful story-boxes coming in each day this week. The children have clearly enjoyed the challenge and have worked incredibly hard at home. Thank you for your support. We teachers had the very tough task of having to select only *one* winner from each class. Thursday's assembly was a lovely celebration of reading and it was fantastic to see everybody's creative outfits.

In our final science lesson on the topic of 'Rocks, soils and fossils' we became paleontologists and excavated chocolate chip 'fossils' from the cookie 'rock'. We used a special tool to help us carefully dig them out. It will certainly be a fun memory many of us will remember about science in Year 3. We are sure that many children will have already shared this memory with their families.

We have continued working with money in Maths this week - subtracting one amount from another amount (for example £10.00 - £6.75 =). We were using a number line to count up from the smaller amount to the larger amount to find the difference between the two (which we have learnt is the same as subtracting). We then moved onto looking at *change* - what this meant and how we worked it out. We enjoyed acting out different scenarios in a shop where change would be given.

Finally, in English, we have continued to complete activities linked to 'The Pebble in My Pocket'. We looked at features of a diary entry (for example, 1st person, written in the past tense, feelings and emotions) and had a go at finding these features in a diary entry. In DERIC, we looked at an extract from 'The Diary of a Killer Cat' and made predictions on what could happen in the story based on the front cover and then on the blurb.
