# Year 3

Dear Parents/Carers,

In English this week, we have now all finished our work on *The Lost Happy Endings*, where we have focused, in particular, on using *noun phrases* (giving a *noun* an *adjective*) and *subordinating conjunctions*. The witch woke up <u>and</u> she remembered Jub's sack, is a compound sentence, i.e. two main clauses joined with a coordinating conjunction. By using noun phrases and a subordinating conjunction, the sentence can be much improved: <u>When the wicked</u> witch woke up from her <u>troubled</u> sleep, she remembered the <u>lumpy</u>, <u>old</u> sack that she had stolen from <u>poor</u> Jub the <u>previous</u> day. During this topic, children have also been taught how to punctuate direct speech, remembering to start a new line for a new speaker, to 'wrap' the spoken words with inverted commas but also to remember to punctuate before 'closing' the speech and tagging on the reporting clause (Example: "Why do you write such happy endings?" cried the witch.)

This week in Maths, we have completed our work on *Statistics* by reading and interpreting tables. In addition, the children have taken a couple of miniassessments on *Money* and *Geometry*.

In Science, most of us have continued our work on plants by looking at absorption through the stem. In order to observe this process, we have placed celery/carnations in coloured water.

Our votes for schools topic (PSHE) was a debate around whether people should be given second chances. It was very interesting to listen to the children sharing their ideas and justifying their views before going on to vote 'yay' or 'nay'. The different classes' results are again displayed in the corridor near the computing suite.

We would like to thank you for your continued support throughout this busy term and would like to wish you all a restful couple of weeks, loading up the batteries for the final third of Year 3! (Speaking of 1/3s - we will start tackling the amazing topic of *Fractions* when we come back together on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April so keep practising those times tables!).
