## Year 3

## Dear Parents and Carers,

In English this week, we have continued our work based on Escape From Pompeii by developing the children's skills in using prepositions to add detail to their sentences, making them more engaging to the reader. We have also analysed the 'model' text of three paragraphs, discovering what makes it a 'good' piece of writing, as well as begun the familiar process of planning, drafting and editing our own version.

Last week, we covered but a fraction(!) of our current Maths topic. This week has seen us getting to grips with being able to find equivalent fractions (i.e. fractions with the same value), both practically and visually (in diagrams), but crucially also being able to prove equivalence mathematically through careful calculation. Remember, whatever the numerator has been multiplied or divided by, must also be done to the denominator. The challenge is to remember to think in the same 'direction' and not multiply one and divide the other. It has become evident that some children are still not secure in using their division facts; if this is true for your child, please support them by keeping up the practice.

In Science, as part of learning about pollination, we have dissected flowers to make close observations of the reproductive parts of the carpel and stamen. Our trip to Gatton Park has (and, for $2 / 3$ of us, will have) been a perfect link to our topic of plants. Children sharing their own understanding and experiences of flowers, and their purpose, has been fruit(!)ful and has clearly sewn seeds(!) of interest for further exploration.

In RE, we continued to learn about Passover and the Exodus story in relation to Judaism. We looked at the Ten Commandments and then wrote our own commandments that would be appropriate in order to live a happy life.

Our 'Votes for Schools' topic (PSHE) was a debate around whether we should go to protest for climate change! The children had a long discussion about what should be done in order to protect our planet. The majority of the children voted 'yes' to going on a protest!

Spelling: This week, the phonics group have consolidated their spelling of the 'ee' phoneme (weekly, luckily, equal, money, shield, leaves, complete). The other groups have explored and practised words with 'ch' for spelling ' $k$ ' also looking at spelling rules (anchor, chaos, character, chorus, echo, monarch, stomach)
