English

Maths

In maths this week, we have been learning the place value of digits in numbers up to 100. We have counted forwards and backwards to 100 using a 100 square. We have also use dienes to partition and combine numbers. We have recorded our place value sentences as 43 = 4 tens and 3 ones.

Talking point: Choose a number between 0 and 100. Ask a family member to ask questions in order to guess the number you are thinking of.

Topic

In **Geography** this week the children have looked at the seven continents of the world. They have found them on a map and labelled them.

In **Science** the children have been looking at Carnivores, herbivores and omnivores and sorted animals out according to what they eat.
