Dear Parents and Carers,

The week started in real style with a terrific D&T morning where the children designed, made and evaluated their own seawigs. Mrs Vincer, the school's English specialist, came to award a winning wig from each class (see photo overleaf!). Thank you for your contributions towards these creations.

In English, we have completed our non-chronological report for our own rambling isles. The children have shown great effort to keep to the tricky, non-fiction style of writing. We have also just started exploring our new book, *Zoo* by Anthony Browne. In an activity to practise narrative predictive skills, the children have looked carefully at the pictures and imagined the story line, retelling this in small groups. Having then actually read the story, the children were invited to share their immediate responses and to raise questions, as well as to explore the deeper themes.

In Maths, we have continued our work on telling the time and this week we have concentrated on reading the analogue clock face to the nearest minute, also solving reasoning problems around this.

In Science, the children have learnt about the different food groups and what makes a balanced meal. In a D&T style lesson, we all had enormous fun creating models of a healthy main meal. We were all shocked by how small an amount of sugar the government's recommended daily intake is and how much sugar lurks in seemingly harmless foods. Can your child remember how many teaspoons is the recommended daily amount?
