This week in Maths, we have continued looking at place value. We have practised identifying and estimating a number on a number line, which lots of us have found quite tricky.

It turns out it was a dragon fruit tree! Throughout the week we were able to design our own dragon fruit trees and use adjectives with a noun (noun phrase) to describe them.

In Geography, we have carried on with our topic 'The UK and mapping skills' by learning about different counties and what they are known for. We were impressed to see that some of the children knew what Yorkshire and Devon were famous for!

We enjoyed looking at different types of light in Science and deciding whether they were a natural or man-made source of light, or whether they only reflected light well. We have also learnt that light travels in a straight line and that we need it to see.
