Dear Parents & Carers,

For Arts Week, we have been busy looking at the Maths in Art. We have been basing our artwork using Fibonacci's ideas as well as drawing with a compass to create circular designs. We look forward to showing you our creations in the upcoming Arts Week Exhibition which is 6/7 February.
