Cornflower Class had a good but very wet forest fun session on Thursday! Lavender class are next week – please remember wellington boots.




In maths this week we finished our Length and Height topic by using rulers to measure objects. We were able to measure lines and draw lines to the exact cm. Then we moved onto our Weight topic where we discussed what weight means and how we measure weight. We began by looking at scales and comparing objects by what was heaviest and lightest. Once we were able to do this, we discussed balancing the scale to find equal measurements. We put an object in one side of the scale and added cubes to the other side until the scale was balanced. We were able to use the sentence stem: 1 tennis ball = 14 cubes.

English: In literacy this week we have continued with the book Lullabyhullabaloo by Mick Inkpen. The children have created their own Lullabyhullabaloo book by thinking about their own characters and what sounds they made that woke the princess! We finished the week by writing an apology letter to the princess for waking her up.

Phonics: In phonics this week we have looked at: 'c' making the /s/ sound (e.g ice, cell), ce also making the /s/ sound (e.g sauce, glance), the 'g' making the /j/ sound (e.g magic, energy) and the 'dge' sound making the /j/ sound (e.g fudge, hedge)

Geography: In preparation for our local area walk next week in geography we have looked at the significant places in our local area such as Tiffin Girls school and the Hawker Centre, we also looked at our own homes which we found using google earth! The children were very excited to show everyone where they lived!
