English

This week we have been continuing our work on composition to 100. We have been using our knowledge of addition and subtraction of multiples of ten and bridging through one hundred to solve calculations and word problems. We have looked at the place value of numbers between 0 and 199 and the different representations we could use to show a number.

Foundation Subjects

In Science we have started learning that soil is partly made from broken down rocks and organic matter by making mini-composting bins, complete with worms and all! We will then enjoy observing the contents over a period of time to see more soil created for our school garden. Thank you for supplying us with the plastic bottles.
