English

We started the week enjoying reading, absorbing and learning from our model non-chronological report on a rambling isle, inspired by our story of *Oliver and the Seawigs*. We are trying to use precise, descriptive vocabulary, appropriate for the genre and are taking up the challenge of learning how to write in a formal style.

Maths

This week we have been counting in 2s, 20s, 5s, 50s and 25s. We understand that multiples of 20 and 50 are ten times bigger than the multiples of 2 and 5. We have ended the week by reasoning about the different multiples and what they have in common.

Foundation Subjects

In science, we have investigated magnetic and non-magnetic materials. We were fascinated to discover the reasons why only some coins are magnetic, depending on which metals they are made with.

In geography, we used our newly acquired knowledge of map symbols to create our own map of a city including a key. Throughout this topic, we are developing our understanding of the advantages and disadvantages of living in a large city, using London as our focus.
