English

This week in English, we have immersed ourselves in the world of traditional fairy tales. Reading the begi of Carol Ann Duffy's, The Lost Happy Endings, the children have identified expanded noun phrases, advand prepositional phrases. We have also revisited the punctuation of speech and the children have practised transferring characters' conversation into reported speech. To support our work in school, fee to read and retell any traditional fairy tales (not Disney!) at home.

Maths

In maths, we have been learning how to calculate using column subtraction. We are able to identify use minuend - subtrahend = difference in a calculation. We have used dienes to help us understand he exchange across from ten to ones and hundreds to tens. We are able to align the column subtractions carefully and carry over where needed.

Foundation Subjects

The children were fascinated to start our new history topic on the *Romans in Britain*. We began by revisiting the Iron Age and what it was like to live as a Celt at the time of Julius Caesar's unsuccessful invasions. In science, we have launched our learning on *Animals incl. Humans* by recapping that all living things need food to live, grow and stay healthy. Building on Year 2's learning on healthy eating, we have learnt that animals and humans need the right types and amount of nutrition.
