English

In English this week we have started our new non-fiction book - See Inside Castles. We recapped the features of non-fiction texts and thought about why the Contents page and Index are in alphabetical order. Can your child sing you the Alphabet song? We ended the week writing questions about what we would like to find out about castles and thought about the difference in language used in fiction and non-fiction texts.

Phonics: This week we have looked at the digraphs oe and oa making the long "o" sound. We have also recapped on the trigraphs, air, ear and ure.

Maths

In maths this week we have been looking at fractions. We looked at halving and quartering sapes. The children have found this quite tricky but we have been very impressed with their resilience and perseverance.

Foundation Subjects

DT: We have continued making our castles. This week we have started to create the outer structure of the walls. We have cut out the battlements, a door and have added some decorations. Next week we will be joining the walls and adding the drawbridge!

Science: We continued our unit on Materials. This week the children investigated which material would be best to make a knight's catapult. Ask them what their findings were!
